



Supporting AR Reading Levels with Epic

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- Students can explore AR leveled texts with Epic when they choose 'Explore' at the top of their screen and then select 'AR'. Once they know their AR level, they can select it and find books perfect for them. As a teacher, you also have the ability to create a collection just at their level.
- Personalized reading choices are always going to be a top choice for students. When exploring the AR leveled texts, they always have the option of choosing the books that fit their interests. At the kindergarten level, having premade collections connected to current topics is always a big hit. Students can also search for books about topics that interest them so using the Epic 'search' bar can be helpful but not all books will be AR books and a teacher/para/intern will have to check to see 'if it's a quiz'.
- If you have students who are ready for independent reading, there are so many wonderful books on Epic for students to choose from. Students can read those independently and take the Epic quizzes as practice prior to taking AR quizzes.

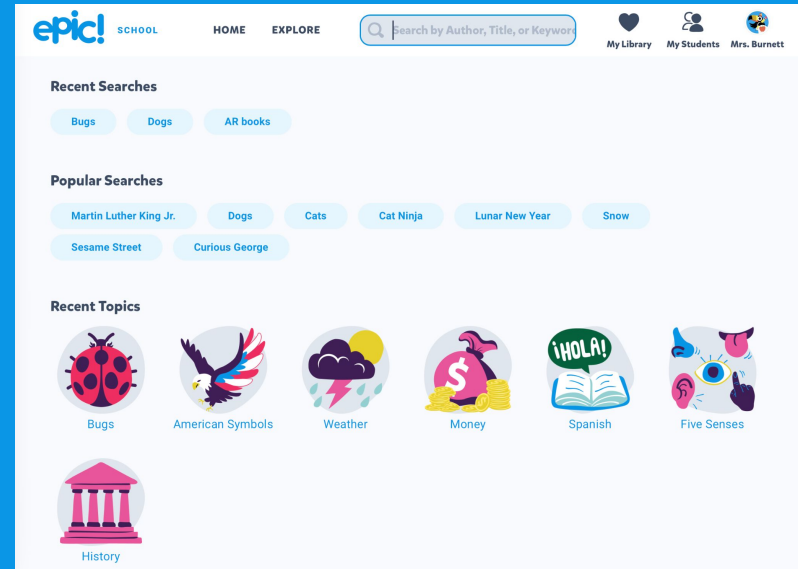
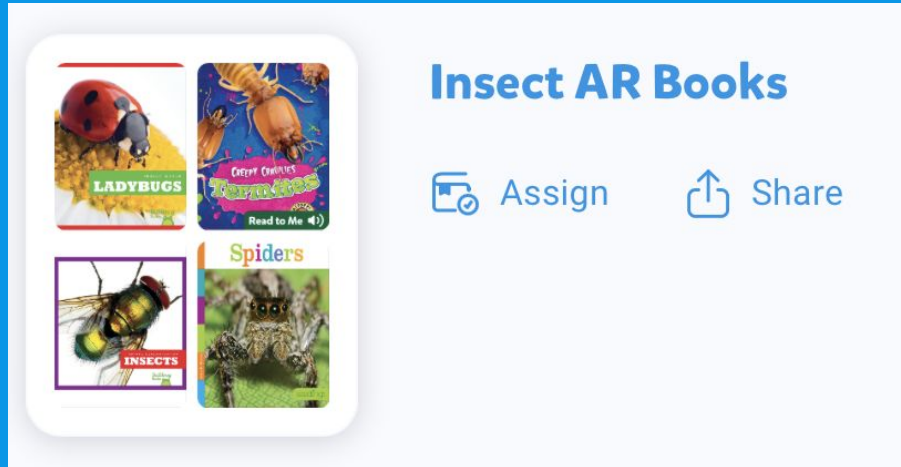

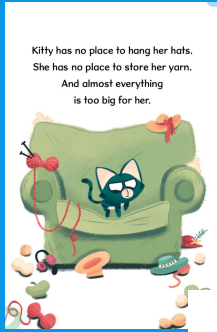
